Presentation: Engineer Halmi gave the following presentation of sewer plant project:

Role of Council - operate the plant, obtain permits and hire personnel.

Role of Sewer Authority - Owner of the plant and projects. Finances and over sees the project.

All Sewage is treated at the plant and clean water is discharged into Elk Creek. All operations are monitored by the Department of Environmental Protection.

8 RBC Units are being replaced at a cost of 1.2 million dollars.

2 Digesters are being replaced.

A sludge press will be installed.

Refurbish and replace miscellaneous equipment.

The project is needed to comply with a Department of Environmental Protection consent order and agreement. The project is slated to begin spring of 2017 and close the end of 2017 at an estimated cost of \$4.5 million dollars. The Authority hopes to obtain a PennVest Loan at 1.74%.
