Call to Order: President Orr called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Ginger L. Cinti, Kaylee L. Orr, Paul D. Orr, Karyn S. Santry, Megan C. Smith, Joshua J. Sturgeon, and Mayor Andrew J. Graves were present

Officials Attending: Edward J. Betza/Solicitor, Joshua Blystone/Foreman, Stacy L. Kibler/Borough Secretary, David M. Wierzchowski/Chief and John Zimmerman/Assistant Operator.

Visitors Attending: Ellen Avlon, Kristina Burfield, Thomas Eberle, Chris Filby, Joshua Minich/Union Representative, Gregg Mitcho, Ronald Rogers, and Daniel Tomko.

Kristina Burfield: of 2655 Spruce Drive, appeared to request council consider amending the animal ordinance to allow for chickens within the borough. Karyn Santry motioned, and Kaylee Orr seconded, to have the solicitor prepare a draft amendment. All agreed except Ginger Cinti. Motion carried.

Minutes: Joshua Sturgeon motioned, and Karyn Santry seconded, to approve December 8, December 22, 2025, and January 5, 2026, minutes as presented. All agreed. Motion carried.

Bills for approval: Joshua Sturgeon motioned, and Karyn Santry seconded, to approve the ~~December~~ bills and ratifications. All agreed. Motion carried.

January

Police Department: Joshua Sturgeon motioned, and Megan Smith seconded to purchase a 2026 Chevy Tahoe from PA Costars Dealer Jim Shorkey Chevrolet of Bakerstown, in the amount of \$58,327.21. All agreed. Motion carried. The patrol vehicle will be purchased with LSA grant funds.

IT: Two quotes were received for IT services for the police department. Techworx quoted a \$6,007.71 setup fee, with a monthly service fee of \$287.40, and 25 Bravo IT Solutions quoted a \$1,937 setup fee, with a monthly service fee of \$315.00. Karyn Santry motioned, and Kaylee Orr seconded, to accept the quote from 25 Bravo IT Solutions. All agreed. Motion carried.

AR-15: Geoffrey Potter donated two AR-15s, with scopes, with an estimated value of \$4,200 to the police department.

Street Foreman: The union representative and street foreman were introduced to the new council. The foreman oversees the streets department. Council told the street foreman he was doing a great job. 2.9.26

Elm Street: The solicitor determined the property located at 10259 Elm Street is a private drive. Joshua Sturgeon motioned, and Ginger Cinti seconded, to continue to plow the 50' past Elm Street with a road maintenance agreement. All agreed. Motion carried.

Salt Spreader: One bid was received for the steel-caster stainless steel hopper spreader, with a gasoline engine, from John Zimmerman in the amount of \$310. Joshua Sturgeon motioned, and Karyn Santry seconded, to accept the bid from John Zimmerman. All agreed. Motion carried.

Order of Business: Karyn Santry motioned, and Kaylee Orr seconded, to accept resolution 1/12/26, with the public comment period being five minutes. All agreed. Motion carried.

Mutual Aid Resolution: Joshua Sturgeon motioned, and Ginger Cinti seconded, to approve reaffirming the mutual aid agreement with Girard Borough. All agreed. Motion carried.

County Aid Resolution: Joshua Sturgeon motioned, and Megan Smith seconded, to approve the county aid resolution. All agreed. Motion carried. The \$9,930 will be used for streetlighting.

Recessed: President Orr recessed the meeting at 6:55 p.m. for union employees' personnel matters.

Reconvened: President Orr reconvened the meeting at 7:49 p.m.


Wage Increase: The pay will remain, as stated, in the union contract for Jack Dipolito.
